FITS Uganda is a community based organization (CBO) founded in 2010 and registered as an indigenous non for profit organization in 2015. It operates in Kigezi Sub region of Uganda and envisions towards sustainable agriculture, food and nutrition security and natural resource management. It was founded with mandates focused on mobilizing and empowering local communities to carry out activities in areas of; enhancing food and Nutrition security, ensuring profitable income generation through sustainable agriculture as well as environmental protection. FITS Uganda promotes agro forestry, soil and water conservation, sustainable agriculture practices for increased food security and incomes to the majority rural communities where it operates from. Since its inception in 2010, FITS Uganda strategic actions have been directed at improving the lives of the poor, vulnerable and marginalized through community empowerment and provision of material and technical support through a multi-program approach in areas of sustainable agriculture and natural resources management.

The organization has an advisory board composed of 7 members that decides on its strategic direction and takes decisions on organization policies and makes assessment of project implementation, achievements and plans for expansion. It approves budget plans and financial reports and audits and takes on contract agreement decisions. FITS Uganda Board Members are personalities of flawless charisma who among others are professionals in agriculture, environment, social research and advocacy. This is explains the milestone the organization has so far achieved in contributing towards sustainable agriculture, environmental management and poverty reduction in Kigezi Sub region.

For the past 6 years FITS Uganda has been engaging local communities in establishing priorities for community-led natural resources management and improved agriculture. The organization has at several occasions engaged line ministries and district departments in ensuring timely support in policy formulation around sustainable agriculture, equitable allocation and sustainable natural resources management and biodiversity conservation. Engaging private sector is and has also been on heart of FITS Uganda in addressing environmentally harmful methods of extracting local natural resources as well as agriculture development.

At FITS Uganda we strongly believe that enhancing food security while contributing to climate change adaptation and preserving the natural resource base and vital ecosystem services requires

farmers transition to agricultural production systems that are more productive, use inputs more efficiently, have less variability and greater stability in their outputs, and are more resilient to risks, shocks and long-term climate variability. The organization has been involved in awareness creation of the local communities on climate change, natural resource management and agricultural production and has at several occasions empowered them to adopt sustainable locally feasible and economically viable approaches to these aspects.

FITS Uganda in its initiative to alleviate poverty in the Kigezi Sub-region through sustainable agriculture has for the past three years considerably invested in over 70 individual farmers and 15 farmer groups in aquaculture and rabbit farming. In its initiative called "Send a Rabbit", FITS Uganda has so far supported over 70 farmers with over 200 rabbits with support from individuals who would donate a pair of rabbits to deliver to the communities. This initiative was purely driven through simple fundraisings from friends of Fits Uganda.

Fits Uganda continues to train more farmers in Kabale District on how to maximize profits and improve their livelihoods/nutrition through rabbit farming.

Fits Uganda has also participated in improved household nutrition of more than 100 families and two schools through establishment of Kitchen/vegetable gardens

Fits Uganda has also been involved in the implementation of Self help group approach in Bubaare Innovation platform in Rubanda District, where by small self help groups have aggregated to form a community Bank. The 52 self help groups have a savings and credit scheme approach where by pooling of funds together at community Bank level enable borrowing and the groups act as collateral, no security is demanded from the groups. These groups are also engaged in collective value addition of potatoes and bulking of sorghum and reselling to make a profit. This was spearheaded by Twebaze Jeniffer as an Innovation platforms manager with support from the Sub Saharan Challenge Programme an African Union Project.
